

A disclosable outside interest exists if...

- A) The prime sponsor is a Federal agency (NIH, NSF, DOE, DOD, USDA, etc.) and the individual or his/her relative*:
- owns stock or stock options (other than mutual/retirement funds) in any private entity whose products, services, or technology may be considered to be reasonably related to the research; and/or
 - receives compensation (e.g., consulting income, speaker fees, loans, or gifts) from any private entity whose products, services, or technology are considered to be reasonably related to the research; and/or
 - has a management or advisory position with any private entity whose products, services, or technology may be considered to be reasonably related to the research.
- B) The prime sponsor is a private/commercial entity and the individual or his/her relative*:
- owns stock or stock options (other than mutual/retirement funds) in that entity; and/or
 - receives compensation other than salary for the proposed research (e.g., consulting income, speaker fees, loans, or gifts) from the entity; and/or
 - has a management or advisory position with the entity.
- C) The prime sponsor is a public entity other than Federal (state, city, nonprofit, etc.) and the individual or his/her relative*:
- receives compensation other than salary for the proposed research (e.g., consulting income, speaker fees, loans, or gifts) from the entity; and/or
 - has a management or advisory position with the entity.

***Definition of Relative:** A spouse or domestic partner, child, child's child, parent, grandparent, siblings and their spouses, and the parent, sibling or child of your spouse.
